## Rules Revisions

- 1. The 2025-26 NFHS Spirit Rules Book has been redesigned to separate dance rules from cheer rules.
- All cheer-specific definitions are now found in Rule 2. New definitions include assisted walkover, kip up and nugget.
- 3. All dance-specific definitions are now found in Rule 3. New definitions include executing dancer and supporting dancer.
- 4. An extended stunt in which a top person is vertical and supported at the waist can be performed without a spotter.
- 5. A bracer may release the top person or move to a load position during a flip inversion when the top is descending and goes to a cradle or the performance surface.

- An inverted top person is permitted to hold props during a partner cartwheel and an assisted walkover.
- Participants are prohibited from landing or being caught in an inverted position in a stunt or pyramid from an unassisted airborne position.
- A top person in a prep-level skill may be released to a vertical or horizontal position, as long as the release does not significantly exceed that height of the catch by the bases.
- Entire dance rule has been rewritten to provide dance/drill-specific language.
